

BCI is a community-based participatory research (CBPR) project that aims to develop community and policy interventions that reduce exposure of harmful chemicals from personal care products and breast cancer risk for Black people.

The team includes multidisciplinary researchers, community advocates, breast cancer survivors, and hair stylists dedicated to achieving health equity and committed to research and legislative efforts geared towards eliminating harmful exposures to chemicals in hair and other personal care products.





DIY Toothpaste	Ingredients
 Pour 2 tsp of baking soda into a small mixing bowl Add 1-2 tbsp of coconut oil Mix baking soda and coconut oil until it becomes a paste Put mix into container 	Coconut Oil Baking Soda

DIY Body Scrub






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
